

Dangerous Goods

prohibited to fly - Domestic & International

- * Adhesives
- * Aerosols
- * Batteries
- * Chemical Kits
- * Cleaning materials (Handy Andy etc.)
- * CO2 cartridges
- * Fertilizers
- * Fireworks
- * Fuel
- * Inks
- * Lighters
- * Liquids - by prior arrangement
- * Magnets
- * Matches
- * Medical Equipment (hazardous)
- * Paints
- * Propane tanks
- * Smoke alarms
- * Spray cans
- * Toners
- * Weapons



The above is not a definitive list of restricted items and some other products may also be considered as Dangerous Goods.

Remember that it is the shipper's responsibility to classify the products presented to Courier Dynamix for carriage in accordance with international regulations.

Restricted Goods

International shipments require prior arrangements

- * Foodstuff - pending destination country regulations
- * Wine - in accordance with Customs in the destination country

Note: Any goods for human consumption (foodstuff / medical), must comply with Customs regulations and will attract additional inspections by Port Health.

Beware...

Many common items used everyday in the home and the workplace may seem harmless but when transported by air can become very dangerous. In flight, variations in temperature and pressure could cause leaks, generate fumes or start a fire. Should your goods be travelling via road transport and considered dangerous goods you must notify Courier Dynamix, as we utilize all modes of transport. Ensure your paperwork is in order and complies to the destination country.

It's the law...

You must declare your dangerous / hazardous materials to any airline, handling agent, forwarder or courier service. The handling of Dangerous Goods is strictly controlled by international law and individuals / companies found to be in violation of the regulations may be prosecuted. Courier Dynamix is obligated under international laws to advise the regulatory authorities of any individual / company found to be shipping in contravention of these regulations.
